

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE RIDGE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Ridge Board of Directors is pleased to announce the launch of a Neighborhood Watch program for The Ridge. Crime and fear of crime can threaten a community's well-being and it is the goal of The Board to eliminate the conditions that can foster crime in The Ridge. While our neighborhood does not have a severe crime problem, the risks are always present.

Our Neighborhood Watch program is based on a very simple foundation: AWARENESS. Joining this program does not require you to patrol our streets or confront suspicious individuals, it only requires that you be aware of your surroundings and that you communicate with your neighbors. For example, members of the program are encouraged to meet their neighbors, know the names and ages of their children, let neighbors know when you are going to be out of town and keep an eye out for unusual activity or circumstances. You just need to BE AWARE.

Neighbors look for:

- Someone looking into windows and parked cars
- Unusual noises
- Property being removed from house when no one is home
- Cars, vans or trucks moving slowly through the streets with no apparent destination
- Anyone being forced into a vehicle
- A stranger sitting in a vehicle or stopping to talk to a child
- Abandoned Vehicles

Enclosed is an emergency contact form that The Board needs each homeowner to fill out and return to Avalon Management. This information is for the sole purposes of running a successful Neighborhood Watch program and will not be shared with anyone residing outside of The Ridge, with the exception of Avalon Management. Please do not delay in completing and returning this form.

The Neighborhood Watch program members currently meet the 4th Thursday of every month, at 7P.M. Please contact Howard Ramshorn at 600 – 8366 for the location of that meeting. Below is a list of the current members of the program. Please keep in mind that this program only works when you have significant numbers and adequate coverage throughout the neighborhood.
